The Blessing and Value of Peace

I have often wondered whether we say "Rest in Peace (RIP)" when speaking of a person who has passed away because, as long as we humans are alive, peace always seems to remain elusive. And, consequently, we can only truly hope to "Rest in Peace" when we pass into the World to Come.

I do not think that I am alone in this thinking as we see such thoughts reflected in the teachings of Bar Kapara, who said:

"Great is peace, for even the angels, among whom there is no enmity, jealousy, hatred, strife,

rivalry, or dissension, need God to keep peace among them. How much more so, then, do human beings, among whom all these evil dispositions are rife, need God's help that peace may exist among them?!" (*Perek HaShalom 8*).

Does this mean that peace is basically an elusive vision in the eyes of Jewish tradition?

Far from it! Peace is, in fact, an on-going project, a constant challenge, for each and every one of us during our lives.

Our synagogue is named Rodef Sholom [Pursuer of Peace]!

Rabbi Yechiel ben Yekutiel (*Sefer Maalot Hamiddot*) summarizes our tradition's view of peace as follows:

"Seek peace with your friend and pursue it with your enemy. Seek it in your place and pursue it in other places. Seek it with your body and pursue it with your money. Seek it for yourself and pursue it for others. Seek it today and pursue it tomorrow. And do not despair, saying, 'I will never achieve peace,' but pursue it until you do!"

To illustrate the urgent need to keep pursuing peace during our lives, the *Midrash Exodus Rabbah* (12:4) tells the following story:

"There was once a fierce rivalry between a king's two best fighting legions. When the time came for the king to wage war, what did he do? He made peace between them, and they both marched out to fulfill the king's orders together!"

We may disagree with one another, and we may go about being Jews in a variety of ways, but, ultimately, we are all serving God - each one of us in our unique way.

Our tradition reminds us time and again that peace is not only a great vision and a worthy value, it is also considered an over-arching value in that all blessings are included in the one blessing of peace. As we say on Friday night in our Kabbalat Shabbat prayers: *Adonai Oz l'amo yiten* [May God grant our people strength]; *Adonai y'varech et amo vaShalom* [May God bless our people with peace] (Psalm 29:11). All of our mitzvot and all the blessings that we might hope for are encapsulated in the final blessing of peace.

May we do our part to maintain peace and to encourage greater and more lasting peace in our homes, in our communities, and in the world around us, and may we be blessed to live long and healthy lives in pursuit of peace.

President's Message

December is a time of holiday celebrations, school vacations, and family gatherings. It's not easy to give up that time to help those in our community who are literally without a home, but, for over 25 years, members of Rodef Shalom have done just that.

When we were in our Whealton Road home in Hampton, we worked with Hampton Ecumenical Lodging and Provisions—HELP—through their "A Night's Welcome" program to provide a warm place to sleep and two hot meals for those in need of housing for the week that included Christmas. Now, in our new home on City Center Boulevard, we are working with LINK of Hampton Roads through their PORT (People Offering Resources Together) winter shelter program to provide a hot dinner and "breakfast in a bag" for those without housing in Newport News over the Christmas holiday. Whether it was a week's effort for "A Night's Welcome" in Hampton or an evening and morning for PORT in Newport News, it takes many people to make sure that the necessary food is



purchased, that it is prepared and ready for serving, that everything is cleaned up after, and that, in the morning, the dozens of guests have a breakfast to help them start the day with food in hand.

I want to thank all of people listed below for everything they did over several weeks in December 2022 to purchase the food, prepare the food, help with intake at New Grove Baptist Church in Denbigh on December 25th, serve and clean up dinner that night, prepare the "to go" breakfast bags in advance, and then hand those bags out very early on Monday morning, December 26th. Other members of the congregation made donations to our Social Action Fund so

that we could purchase the necessary ingredients and supplies. On a night that was one of the coldest in recent years, we helped to serve almost 90 people, giving them delicious food and a friendly face. Their willingness to volunteer so that others in our community could be served is very much appreciated and makes the words "tikkun Olam"—"repairing the world"—come alive.

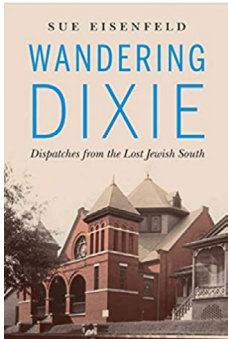

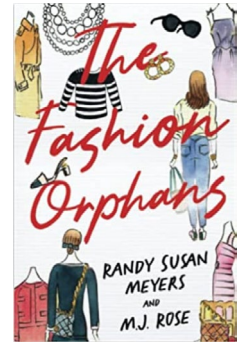
RST Sisterhood

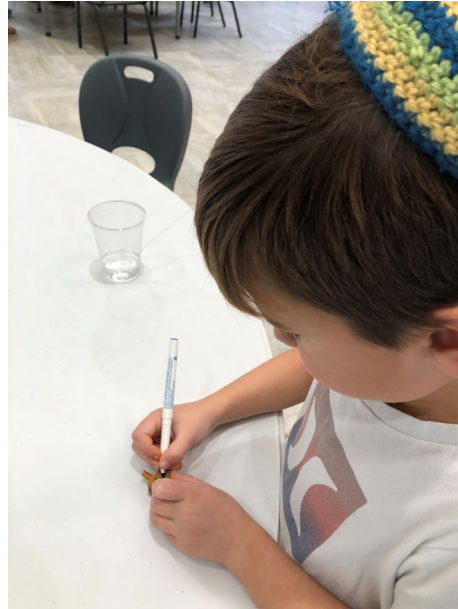

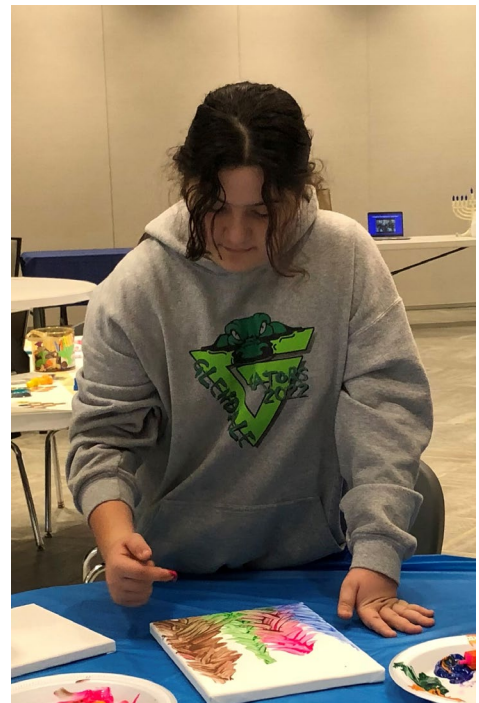

Education Director's Message

Dear Friends,

Jewish texts, prayers, history, and culture span several thousand years and countless nations. Our tradition is rich with wisdom, and Jewish education is an essential piece of transmitting that wisdom.

I believe that Jewish education is Life Education, and this begins with community. Decoding Hebrew letters, prayer rituals, and holiday recipes and games are all an important part of a Jewish education. Our children also learn prayer during a Shabbat service, on a Friday night when parents recite a blessing, and helping to braid challah with a grandparent. Jewish clubs give teens a place to "be Jewish" with peers, and adults join clubs, too, because Jewish education doesn't stop upon graduation from school.

Some important Hebrew words: *Tzedek* and *tikkun olam*, *bal tashchit* and *bikkur cholim*, *shalom bayit* and *lashon hara*. They are but a few of the values at the heart of a Jewish life: Justice, Repairing the World; Don't Waste, Visiting the Sick; Making a Peaceful Home, Avoiding Negative Speech. Jewish educators teach these concepts, rabbis give sermons about them, parents require them, and everyone in the community demonstrates them. That's Jewish education on a larger scale, and it's quite powerful.

At Rodef Sholom, we have so many opportunities to be part of educating one another! A few examples you may not have thought about: I have met a few (and am in awe of) the artists in our congregation, all of whom delight in the beauty and artistry of our world and our Jewish traditions. Perhaps you noticed the greeters and ushers demonstrating *hachnasat orchim*, welcoming guests as they enter the synagogue with a cheery greeting. These are all teachers, too, part of what makes a Jewish education for our children and for our community.

As we wrap up our first semester of Religious School, I am gratified to see the smiles on the faces of our children as they learn the lessons of Jewish children all over the world for hundreds of years: Reading and talking about Torah stories and midrash, singing and reciting Jewish prayers, practicing Hebrew letters, playing games, and painting. And to complement our Sundays together in class, Rodef Sholom children come to Shabbat services where they hear the words and tunes of our people as they pray together, join the community for holidays and other simchas, and notice their own parents and other adults learning and teaching themselves.

Together we are all Jewish educators, and I encourage you to think about your part in it. By the time you read these words, our ISLJ Program Associate weekend will be over (January 6-8), but you will be invited to participate in a Tu B'Shevat program on February 5 that will be for the entire Rodef Sholom community. Spring will lead us to Purim and Pesach and Shavuot, Yom Hashoah and Yom Haatzmaut, several B'nei Mitzvah celebrations, and many opportunities for every one of us to be a teacher and/or a student. I hope you will meet with me to chat about your ideas for the coming year, whether for educating children or for adults, whether about something you'd like to present or something you'd like to learn. Like any good piano player, I take requests!

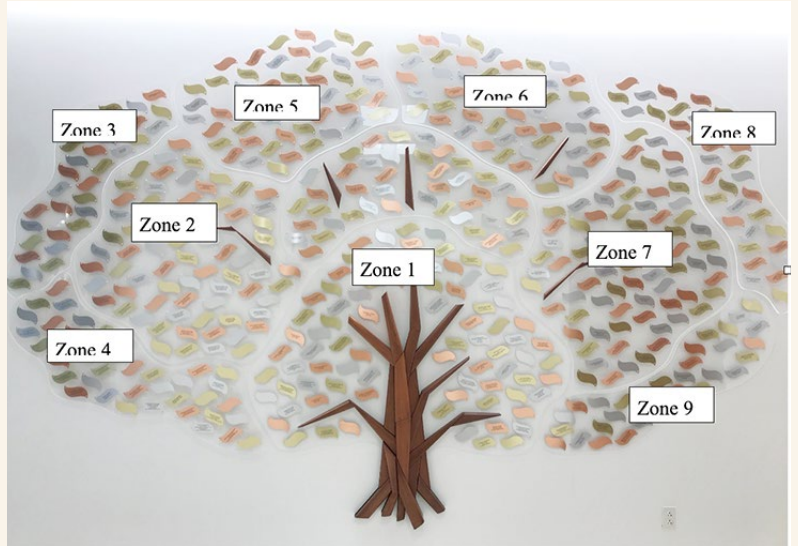

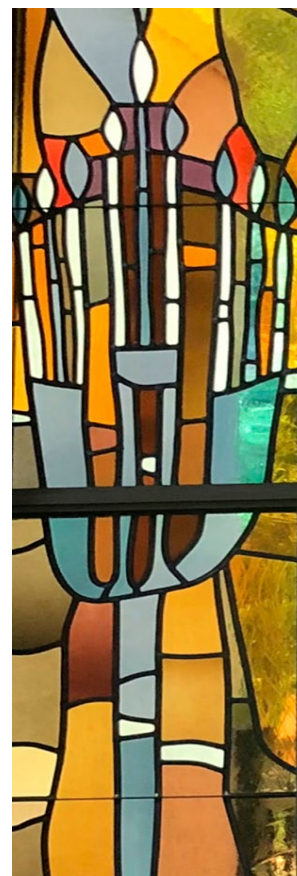
